A remarkable congruence flattens the primary, secondary, and tertiary aspects of communication in this spread from a mainstream clothing retailer's catalog—that is, each aspect is more or less the same relative to each other.

The primary message is clothing. It is visually represented by a neutral photograph of clothing. The target audience is mainstream, concerned with a sense of the genuine; this retailer's customers are not interested in couture fashion.

Further, the coloration of the clothes is a branded message, as well as intrinsic to their design and to the design of the catalog.

Publication Text Components Standard Page Elements

Decisions about typographic color and the hierarchic breaking of space within a page result from addressing the conventional parts of text material that are found in publications. Aside from the running text, there are half a dozen secondary text elements that have evolved to help readers navigate. Navigating text and other content is a culturally based skill that readers derive from the standards set by centuries of development in book structure. Each component of a publication exists in relation to the others, so distinguishing them from each other also means making connections among them.

HEADLINE Often shortened to head. The title of a chapter, section, story, or article. Usually, it is the largest typographic element in a page spread.

DECK A supporting line or short, two- to three-line paragraph that clarifies the content of the headline.

The area where the primary content is located; also called the block. The body is separated from the outer edges by the margins.

FOLIO The page number. Sometimes, the page numbers are arranged near or as part of the running heads, sides, or feet; in such cases, the entire cluster, including the page numbers, is called the folio.

CALLOUTS (OR PULLOUTS) Short excerpts of the running text that are given prominence. Callouts can be quotations from a speaker who was interviewed for the text, or they may simply be important points that the designer or author feels deserve extra attention.

SIDEBAR Content that supplements the primary running text with more detailed information. Often located at the outer edges of the publication (hence the term). but just as often found toward the bottom or top of the spread.

> **CAPTIONS** Descriptive clusters of text that accompany images, giving information about their content or creator.

SUBHEADLINE Often shortened to subhead. Informational markers that indicate the beginnings of new subsections within a larger section, or new paragraphs within running text.

RUNNING HEADS, FEET, OR SIDES

Often shortened to runners. Informational markers that identify the reader's location within the publication. The runners may consist of any combination of the publication title, section, subsection, and author.

Each of these page spreads shares structural elements-folios, running heads, captions-treated in different ways. Note the placement variation in the folios, as well as that of the runners.
