



## Portfolio Project Artifact Examples

Below are examples of the types of artifacts that you could include in your portfolio. This is not an exhaustive list. Artifacts function as evidence of your own particular combination of skills, experience, and knowledge; select artifacts that will assist you in this process. Consider how images might be used to represent your experiences or reinforce elements of your text-based artifacts – e.g. photographs taken on a field school or during an academic exchange.

### Academic Experience

- Artwork or designs
- Blueprints, renderings, or models
- Essays, papers, or posters
- Excerpts from scholarly articles
- Products from capstone projects
- Recorded presentations or slideshows
- Video or audio projects

### Skills or Awards

- Certificates or awards
- Newspaper articles
- Videos (demonstrating skill)

### Study Aboard Programs

- Blog or journal entries
- Products from collaborative or individual projects
- Videos/images (documenting participation in program)

### Lab or Research Experience

- Grant proposals
- Lab reports
- Posters
- Recorded conference presentations or slideshows
- Research philosophy

### Teaching Experience

- Assignments
- Lesson plans
- Recorded lectures or slideshows
- Syllabi
- Teaching philosophy

### Internship, Work, or Volunteer Experience

- Flyers or brochures
- Leadership or service philosophy
- Products from collaborative or individual projects
